INTRODUCTION

1.1 LOCATION

The College of Education, Lanlate, Oyo State is situated in Lanlate town along Lanlate/Iseyin road in Ibarapa East Local Government Area of Oyo State. The College has two sites. Site A is adjacent to Obasanjo Farms. Site B is slightly opposite the site A.

1.2 HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Lanlate once hosted a Campus of old Oyo State College of Education, Ilesa. The Campus was established in 1982 by the administration of late Chief Bola Ige, the then Executive Governor of old Oyo State. The rationalization exercise of the Campuses of the College of Education in the State by the Military Administration led to the closure of the Campus in 1985.

However, the Oyo State Government under the leadership of Late Lamidi Adesina re-opened the Campus on December 11, 2002 as a Campus of Oyo State College of Education, Oyo (now Emmanuel Alayande College of Education, Oyo). Immediately after the Government's announcement was made, the Governing Council of the College under the chairmanship of Prof. Lekan Oyedeji constituted a high

powered Governing Council/Management Committee for the immediate re-opening of the campus.

The host Community accepted the responsibility of supporting the new Campus by donating the site and structures of the erstwhile Lanlate High School for its take-off, while the State Government gave Forty Million Naira as take-off grant. However the National Commission for Colleges of Education, (NCCE) directed that all satellite Campus of Colleges of Education in Nigeria should be closed down in 2013. In order to forestall the closure of the campus again, the government took proactive measures as a result of information received from the Governing Council of Emmanuel Alayande College of Education, Oyo.

The law establishing the College of Education, Lanlate, Oyo State, was enacted by the State House of Assembly in December, 2014. On April 25, 2015, the Executive Governor of Oyo state, Senator Isiaq Abiola Ajimobi signed the law establishing the College of Education, Lanlate, Oyo State, thus making it an autonomous College of Education. Today, the College operates at two sites covering over 100 acres of land at each site. In line with NCCE guidelines, there are six schools namely: School of Education, School of Secondary Education:

(Arts and Social Sciences), (Languages), (Sciences), Vocational and Technical Education) and School of Early Childhood Care and Primary Education.

Since inception, seven thousand, one hundred and eighty three students had been graduated on behalf of Emmanuel Alayande College of Education, Oyo. At present, five thousand, one hundred and ninety students cutting across all levels are being trained in the College.

The legal instrument of the College is the College of Education, Lanlate Law, 2014. The law makes provision for a Governing Council which had been constituted and later inaugurated by the State Government on October 7, 2015.

2.0 THE COLLEGE GOVERNANCE

The College of Education, Lanlate, is an autonomous institution with the primary objective of producing highly qualified and motivated teachers in courses of instruction leading to the award of the Nigeria Certificate in Education (NCE).

The legal basis of the College is the College of Education, Lanlate, Oyo State law 2014. The law makes provision for a Governing Council, the Academic Board, A Congregation, Academic units and convocation.

2.1 The Governing Council

The Governing Council constituted by the Oyo State Government, is the supreme governing authority of the College. It is saddled with the responsibility for the general management of the affairs of the College and in the control of the property and the finances of the College. It is also empowered to anything in its opinion, is capable of carrying out the purposes for which the College is established. It has the power to make rules for the purpose of exercising any of its respective functions or regulating its own procedure.

2.2 Academic Board

The Academic Board has direct overall policy control of the academic and educational programmes as well as co-ordination of the Board of studying in the College.

2.3 Principal Officers of the College

2.3.1 Provost: The Chief Executive of the College, appointed by the Governing Council subject to the approval of the Oyo State Governor.

2.3.2 Deputy Provost: Appointed by the Governing Council subject to the approval of the Governor on the recommendation of the Academic Board to Governing

Council through the Provost and performs such functions as the Provost may from time to time assign to him/her.

2.3.3 Registrar: Appointed by the Governing Council subject to the approval of the Governor. He/she is responsible to the Provost for the general administration of the College except on financial matters.

2.3.4 The College Librarian: Appointed by the Governing Council subject to the approval of the Governor and he/she is responsible to the Provost for the administration of College libraries.

2.3.5 Bursar: Appointed by the Governing Council subject to the approval of the Governor and he/she is responsible to the Provost for the administration of financial matters.

2.3.6 Director of Works: Appointed by the Governing Council subject to the approval of the Governor and he/she is responsible to the Provost for the administration of Works and Maintenance services.

3.0 SCHOOLS

Each school is headed by a Dean. Heads of Department are directly appointed by the Provost on the advice of the Deans. They are responsible to the Provost. The College has the following schools offering different courses:

4.0 CENTRE FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION AND PART-TIME PROGRAMMES
